Principal's Piece

Welcome back to Term Three. Once again we are going to have a busy term. Teachers have been planning their term's work and have also had a busy day on Monday 17th July which was our School Development Day. We covered information with our School Psychologist Cassandra Zec about planning for childrens' needs using Documented Plans. Later we worked on our own school planning to refine our school plans for 2017 – 18.

Our school P&C has been the recipient of a \$30 000 grant to improve our oval and courts. This grant has been received as a result of discussions between the P&C and representatives of our present State Government. The expenditure of this grant and school financial commitments will be discussed at our P&C meeting on Wednesday 26th. Thanks to our P&C representatives who lobbied for this grant over the past months.

We have started off with a very wet July but this has not deterred Mr Levy from running our Phys Ed sessions. Students are in preparation for our Faction Athletics Carnival which will take place in Week Nine of this term. This is a big event on our calendar and we are all looking forward to it.

We are continuing our planning with our Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) program throughout this term. PBS is framework for setting up ways for students to base their behaviours on the mantras of "We are respectful", "We are learners", and "We are kind". Behaviours are explicitly taught and students will find it a useful way of identifying their positive and negative behaviours. School staff will also be able to use the framework for teaching positive behaviours. Mr Mainard, Ms Aitken and Ms Russell are having a planning day on Tuesday 25th July.

At the beginning of the year the P&C and School Council submitted a request to review the school uniform and its quality and presentation. The school Council then formed a sub-committee to look at a process for finding uniform suppliers and getting things going. The supplier Nell Gray was chosen as a result of their expertise. They met with school staff and with Jo Megee for discussions around choices, availability and cost.

They have been able to come up with a number of concept designs which are displayed in the staff room. The P&C will examine these designs at their meeting on Wednesday 26th July. I am sure everyone is interested in what things may look like so Kylie has placed a photo of the sample designs in this newsletter. The designs will be displayed in the window of the admin area from Thursday this week. Please stop by and have a look.

Last term we had a visit from the Yirra Yaakin Noongar theatre group to perform the production "Boodjar Kaatijin". This means knowledge of country. The production was put on for the whole school and was particularly popular with students. They learnt a number of Noongar Creation stories and some Noongar language as well.

This term we will be having the Constable Care incursion on Tuesday the 1st August and on Monday 18th September in Week Ten we will be having the Musica Viva incursion for the whole school.

Thanks to Brad Pettitt who came up with his Bobcat last term and moved the rocks away in the top car park. This has enabled parents to drive in and park their cars at angle facing out to the street. This means a much safer exit for cars and students.

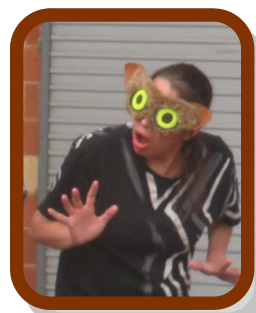
