Principal's Piece

School Uniforms. We have had some concept designs for new school uniforms on display in the front fover for comment. Many students and parents have had a look and provided feedback to our uniform subcommittee. Staff have had a look as well as the P&C and School Council members. Comments have been provided subcommittee made up of Staff, P&C and School Council. Our uniform provider Nell Gray will be doing up a concept design based on the feedback provided and this will be available to us shortly. It has been an exciting time for us to hear of the different ideas and possibilities from everyone and I would like to thank all involved for your well thought out contributions. There have been many views and many opinions on colours, combinations, emblem, piping, stitching etc. There was an overwhelming view that we retain maroon as our colour and that we have black in there as well. We have had comment on what would wear best, shrink less, absorb sweat, and wash well or not show up dirt. I look forward to our concept designs in a week or so.

Teachmeet is an informal way for educators to gather, present ideas and discuss topics in education. Walliston Primary school was very proud to host our first Hills Teachmeet session last Tuesday after school. The topics were centred around technology in classrooms, learning environments and STEM. About 50 teachers from around the area and from further afield gathered in room 8. The session went for about an hour and a half with a break for afternoon tea. It was a highly successful afternoon and an excellent opportunity for teachers to direct their own professional learning.

Staff training. Mrs Thomson and Mrs Mainard recently attended a professional development session at Princess Margaret Hospital for the launch of a mental health program called Big Splash. The program has come about due to the increase in issues in younger children related to anxiety, insecurity and suicidal thoughts. The

program is described as an early intervention model which provides a catalyst for children to talk about their feelings and develop strategies to cope with negative thoughts. The school, with a donation from the P&C, has purchased a dolphin which is part of the theme of looking after your "Pod". As a school we will be looking at a range of programs that assists our students in the area of resilience and self-esteem.

Mini Lit is an evidence based reading program which is designed to assist those students who are struggling in the early years of schooling. Mini Lit has been proven to lift students reading abilities so that they are able to perform reading tasks that are age appropriate. Students work in small groups and are regularly monitored for progress. Lessons are clearly set out and easily followed. We will be introducing Min Lit in Term Four. Mrs Foote and Mrs Smith are attending training this week.

Admin Upgrade We have received quotes for carpet which is in need of replacement in the Administration Block. The current carpet has been down for a long time and is very worn and tired looking. We hope to get the carpet layed during the next school holidays.

Projectors and Electronics. We are purchasing a projector to be installed in the undercover area. This will hopefully be in before open night. We are also ordering some new electronic boards for classrooms. Mr Mainard has managed to obtain a buy two get one free offer! Good news for us.

Go Karts. Room 8 students are once again participating in this year's Le Mens challenge at Falls Road Primary School in week 9. We had a high turnout of parent and family helpers this week to assist the students in constructing their 'Go Karts'. They will be painted and numbered in readiness for our own speed trials which will be conducted before the main event.
